



## Welcome as an affiliated researcher at Örebro University

Following your application, the Faculty Board of Medicine and Health has decided to appoint you affiliated researcher at Örebro University.

The agreement signed between Region Örebro County (RÖL) and Örebro University (ORU) stipulates your access to the following services:

- ORU account. A personal account for login to the University's intranet (Inforum), access to the wireless network eduroam, and access to a personal email address in Örebro University email domain (oru.se).
- Örebro University Library. Access to all electronic resources such as journals, databases and books wherever your whereabouts. All resources are accessed via the library's website [www.oru.se/ub](http://www.oru.se/ub). If you are off University campus, you are required to log in using your ORU account. We would like to remind you that your login data is for your use only, and in accordance with our agreements with the publishers, only those affiliated to Örebro University have access rights to e-resources outside the library premises. You are of course also welcome to borrow books at the library and receive support on information retrieval and reference management.
- Research communication support. The Communications Office offers support to researchers in disseminating their work to the public, policy-makers, organisations and business etcetera – via media or as direct communication. Support is also offered when writing grant application summaries, as are advice and support on popular science writing, whether it is intended for the Internet or for print. There is also the possibility to receive media training.
- Support in applying for external research grants where ORU is the administrating organisation [www.oru.se/go/](http://www.oru.se/go/). (In cases when RÖL is the administrating organisation, there is a support function at Campus USÖ.)

The agreement also stipulates that your obligations include:

- Registering all your scholarly publications in the University's publications database (DiVA). Information on registering publications in DiVA and the support available from the library can be found on the library's website [www.oru.se/ub](http://www.oru.se/ub).
- Specifying the following publishing address on your scholarly publications:  
School of Medical Sciences, Faculty of Medicine and Health, Örebro University, Örebro SE-701 82, Sweden.

As an affiliated researcher you are also entitled to a personal page on our website. In addition, you are able to register your research in the University's research database and have your research highlighted on the University's website.
