

IAPL 2024 Call for papers

Cultural differences and their influence in proceedings

The Annual Congress of the International Association of Procedural Law 2024 (IAPL 2024) will take place in Örebro, Sweden, 9–11 October, 2024, arranged by Örebro University. The main theme is *Procedural Law in Multicultural Context*.

This is a call for papers for Session IV in the morning of the second day, 10 October, 2024, which will include papers on the topic *Cultural differences and their influence in proceedings*.

All interested are invited to submit a document with their profile and a brief summary of the paper they would like to present (no more than 10,000 characters, including spaces and footnotes), no later than **2 May, 2024**. The proposal may be written in English, French, German or Spanish. It should focus on issues related to the topic *Cultural differences and their influence in proceedings*. Proposals on topics outside the main theme will not be considered. Only one proposal per person may be submitted.

After a selection process several selected papers can be presented during Session IV. Information on which contributions have been selected will be presented by email no later than 1 June 2024. The following criteria will be applied: (i) approach to the main theme of the Congress and the topic of Session IV; (ii) innovation and creativity; (iii) reasoning and originality; (iv) argumentation, clarity and coherence of the content.

The authors of the selected papers will be invited to submit a detailed text of their contributions (with a maximum length of 50,000 characters, including spaces, footnotes, and bibliography), no later than **30 August, 2024**. The paper must be accompanied by a summary in English (maximum 200 words). Papers that are selected for presentation will be distributed in electronic form and may also be published separately.
