The title of my presentation is: **Identifying Citizens, Regulating Migrants: Case studies from Twentieth Century Irish History**

Dr. Jennifer Redmond is Associate Professor in Twentieth Century Irish History in the Department of History at Maynooth University. She researches, teaches and publishes in the areas of women's and gender history with a focus on identity, citizenship, employment, sexualities and migration. She is the Chair and main proposer of the <u>COST</u> <u>Action HIDDEN: History of Identity Documentation in European Nations</u> which brings together scholars in different disciplines across the EU and its affiliated members to examine issues of identity documentation, migration and citizenship historically and in the present. <u>The network</u> runs from October 2022 to October 2026 and incorporates five thematic Work Groups with public facing as well as academic outputs. The network will hold its second major conference in May on the Past, Present and Future of Identity Documentation which will lead to a scholarly handbook.
