

Living Costs

- Budget for approx. 8,500 SEK per month – this is about 820 EUR or 920 USD - to cover rent, bills and other expenses
- Average student housing costs 3500 SEK per month

Örebro University Scholarship

10. Tuition Fees

Tuition Fees

- You will receive your first invoice from the university within the coming days
- If you are paying for the tuition fees yourself and have any issues, please contact our Admissions team – freemover@oru.se



11. Residence Permits & Fundings

- You will need a residence permit **before** you come to Sweden
- You will need to have **paid your first tuition fee instalment** and provide supporting documents
- The University will automatically notify the Swedish Migration Agency when you have paid the tuition fee

11. Residence Permits & Fundings

Study period	Permit validity period	Maintenance requirement
One-Year Programme	1st August 2019 – 30 June 2020	83.700 SEK (10 x 8.370 SEK)
Two-Year Programme	1st August 2019 – 1st September 2020	92.070 SEK (11 x 8.370 SEK)

The periods shown in the table below are general. The period of validity for a residence permit is specified in the decision from the Migration Agency.

- **Extension: Apply at the earliest six months before your current permit expires**

11. Residence Permits & Fundings

- Bank statements should not be earlier than 3 months of when you receive your residence permit, which usually starts on 1 August → Do not apply earlier than 1 May
- A residence permit application can take **three months** to process
- However - if you are dependent on a scholarship, you must wait until you have received the scholarship before applying for a permit

12. Key tips

- **YOU** have to be the account holder of your bank statements → no shared accounts or accounts from parents will be accepted
- You cannot obtain a residence permit longer than you passport's period of validity → make sure extend your passport if it is about to expire
- Apply as soon as possible after May 1st
- An incomplete application send in early will take longer to process than a complete application sent in later
